



# **Before You List Your Home**

To ease your stress, here are some awesome selling tips that will help you get on the right path. Some of these tips are surprisingly easy, while others might require a bit more elbow grease.

### Clean up, fix up and paint up outside

- Invest in landscaping where it can be seen at first sight. A well manicured lawn, neatly clipped shrubbery, cleanly swept walks create a good first impression.
- An extra shot of fertilizer, in season, will make your grass look lush and green.
- Cut back overgrown shrubbery that keeps light out of the house.
- Paint your house if necessary. This can probably do more for sales appeal than any other factor. At least touch up front shutters and window frames.
- In the winter walks should be free of snow/ice.
- Inspect the roof and gutters. Check for any missing shingles and gutters and down spouts to replace.
- Consider putting flowers outside the front door.
- · Repaint the front door.
- Paint your mailbox a bright color.
- Repair broken outdoor steps.

#### Kitchen

- The kitchen is the most important room in the house. Make it bright and attractive. Paint cabinets and put up perky new curtains.
- Clean the ventilating hood in the kitchen.
- If the kitchen floor is badly worn, put down new flooring. Replace any loose tiles and regrout where needed.
- Remove any appliances that you keep on your counters as clean counters can make the room look much larger.

## **Living Areas**

- · Have all drywall in good shape. Repair cracks and touch up paint.
- Check ceilings for leak stains. Repair any issues and repaint.
- In painting and redecorating, avoid offbeat colors, stick to neutral and soft colors outside and easy-to-work-with neutrals inside.
- · Replace faded curtains or bedspreads.
- If you have a fireplace, clean it out and place some logs in it.
- Wash windows, inside and out.
- Replace broken glass panes.
- Replace torn screens.
- · Check that all windows open and close.
- Replace dim or burned-out light bulbs.
- Make sure every light switch works.

- Make the floors shine; clean and polish them. Nail down any creaking boards or stair treads.
- Straighten the closets and get rid of excess items. Use air freshener to eliminate odors.
- For doors that stick slightly, rub a block of paraffin against the surface that shows signs of wear or lubricate squeaky hinges.
- . For sliding doors that stick in their tracks, rub tracks with paraffin or wax.

### **Bathroom**

- Repair dripping faucets.
- Keep fresh towels in the bathroom.
- Remove stains from toilets, bathtubs, and sinks.
- If sinks and bathtubs drain slowly, unclog them.

## Basement, Attic and Garage

- Clean out attic, basement and garage and dispose of everything you aren't moving.
- Make sure there's plenty of light on the stairs to the basement.
- If your basement is dark and gloomy, paint ceilings and walls a light color.
- Repair cracks in the basement floor.

# When your house is being shown

- Keep room draperies open to let in light. This makes rooms appear larger.
- Have your home well-lit during showing.
- At night, turn on porch and outdoor lighting.
- Neatness makes a room look bigger.
- If possible, leave your furniture and rugs in the house for the showing.
- Remove dirty dishes in the sink.
- Keep any toys in the children's rooms.
- Keep radio, stereo, TV off or turned down.
- Take your family away during an open house.
- Take children on a drive or to play outside.
- Refer inquiries about seeing your house to your Realtor.
  Don't mention furniture or furnishings you wish to dispose of unless asked.
- Take pets outdoors during a showing.
- Let the real estate expert show your house, and don't tag along.
- Answer questions candidly when asked, but don't offer answers to unasked questions.
