







Looking for some way to keep cool this summer, or maybe someplace to go fishing or boating. Check out these local DFW Area lakes:

Lake Ray Roberts

On the Elm Fork of the Trinity River, 10 miles north of Denton off FM 455. The dam is in Denton County but pushes water into Cooke and Grayson counties.

Surface area: 25,600 acres Maximum depth: 106 feet Fish Species: Largemouth bass; White bass; Channel catfish; Crappie; Sunfish

Lewisville Lake

On the Elm Fork of the Trinity River in Denton County near Lewisville Surface area: 29,592 acres Maximum depth: 67 feet Fish Species: Largemouth bass; Spotted bass; White & hybrid striped bass; White crappie; Blue & channel

Grapevine Lake

catfish

On Denton Creek, a tributary of the Elm Fork of the Trinity River in Tarrant and Denton Counties, just north of the City of Grapevine
Surface area: 6,684 acres

Maximum depth: 65 feet

Fish Species: Largemouth bass; Spotted bass; White bass; White crappie; Channel catfish

Lavon Lake

In Collin County northeast of Dallas and 4 miles northeast of Wylie, off Texas Highway 78 Surface area: 21,400 acres Maximum depth: 59 feet Fish Species: Largemouth bass; White bass; Channel & blue catfish; Crappie

Lake Ray Hubbard

In Collin, Dallas, Rockwall and Kaufman counties, one mile west of Rockwall on the East Fork of the Trinity River Surface area: 21,671 acres Maximum depth: 40 feet Fish Species: White & hybrid striped bass; Largemouth bass; Channel & blue catfish; White crappie

White Rock Lake

In the City of Dallas on White Rock Creek, a tributary of the Trinity River Surface area: 1,088 acres Maximum depth: 20 feet Fish Species: Channel catfish; Largemouth bass; White crappie

Mountain Creek Lake

In Dallas County four miles southeast of Grand Prairie on Mountain Creek, a tributary of the Trinity River
Surface area: 2,493 acres
Maximum depth: 26 feet
Fish Species: Largemouth bass;
Channel catfish; White bass; White

Joe Pool Lake

crappie

In Tarrant, Ellis, and Dallas Counties four miles south of Grand Prairie on Mountain Creek, a tributary of the Trinity River Surface area: 6,469 acres

Maximum depth: 75 feet Fish Species: Largemouth bass; White bass; White crappie; Channel catfish

Lake Arlington

On Village Creek, a tributary of the West Fork Trinity River, just north of Interstate 20 off Arkansas Lane in Arlington

Surface area: 1,939 acres Maximum depth: 51 feet Fish Species: Florida largemouth bass;

White bass; White crappie; Channel & flathead catfish

Benbrook Lake

off US 377 in Tarrant County, 10 miles southwest of downtown Fort Worth Surface area: 3,635 acres Maximum depth: 70 feet Fish Species: Largemouth bass; White & hybrid striped bass; Crappie; Blue & channel catfish

On the Clear Fork of the Trinity River,

Lake Worth

On the West Fork of the Trinity River, entirely within the Fort Worth city limits

Surface area: 3,489 acres Maximum depth: 22 feet Fish Species: White crappie; Largemouth bass; Spotted bass;

Eagle Mountain Lake

White bass; Catfish

On the West Fork Trinity River, just north of Fort Worth and Lake Worth in Tarrant County

Surface area: 8,738 acres Maximum depth: 47 feet

Fish Species: Largemouth bass; Spotted bass; Channel catfish; White bass; White crappie
